7.1 TRAVEL to the USA

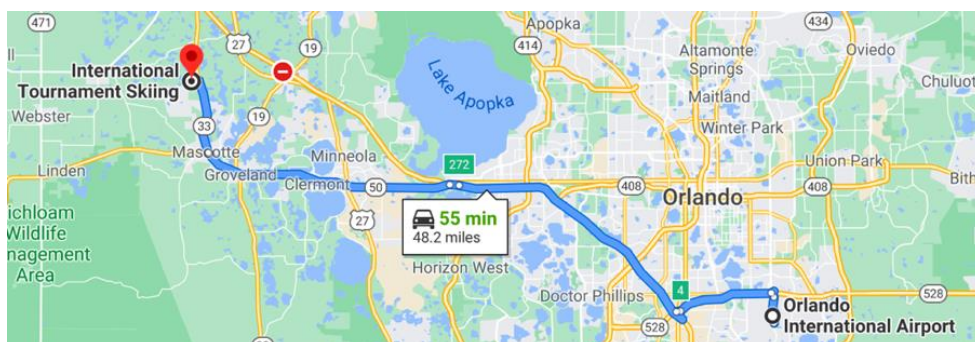
Non-U.S. travellers seeking to enter the United States via land ports of entry and ferry terminals at the U.S.-Mexico and U.S.-Canada borders are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and provide proof of vaccination upon request – [link to general travel information](#)

7.2 VISA

Your passport must be valid for at least six months beyond your period of stay in the United States (unless exempt by country-specific agreements). Located 76 km (48.2 miles) from Jack Travers Waterski School, Orlando International Airport is a major public airport.

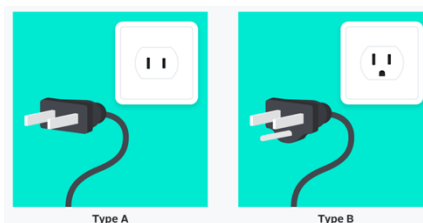


7.4 Currency

The local currency is the US Dollars (USD). Credit and debit cards are widely accepted.

7.5 Electricity

Electricity supply in the USA is 120 volts at 60 Hz. There are two associated plug types, types A and B. Plug type A is the plug which has two flat parallel pins and plug type B



is the plug which has two flat parallel pins and a grounding pin. It is advisable to bring a plug adapter with you, though most hotels can supply adapters for other kinds of plugs and they can be bought locally.

10. INSURANCE

10.1 USA Water Ski & Wake Sports Insurance

All athletes are required to sign up as **guest** members of USA Water Ski & Wake Sports for insurance purpose before they are permitted to compete. There will be NO cost for the membership. Federations should ensure their athletes are signed up **BEFORE** official familiarisation begins using this [link](#).

10.2 Travel Insurance

The IWWF Bye-Law 16.1 states:

It is the responsibility of each Federation when entering competitors for a World Titled Event to ensure that its competitors are adequately insured for personal accident, permanent disabilities, death and **medical expenses**. Please note that the insurance provided by the membership to USA Water Ski & Wake Sports does **NOT** include medical expenses.

11 OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS

11.1 Opening Ceremony

The opening ceremony will be held at [Victory Pointe in Clermont](#) on Tuesday 10th October 2023 starting 6:00 pm. Teams should be dressed in team track suits and be assembled by 5:30 pm. There will be a reception after the Opening Ceremony with free admission for Athletes, one Team Official per team (or two Team Officials for teams of 8 or more athletes), Technical Officials and IWWF Executive Board Members.



11.2 Closing Ceremony & Final Night Banquet

The closing ceremony and final night banquet will be held at [Clermont Arts & Recreation Center \(directions\)](#) in the [Mainstage Theatre](#) on Sunday 15th October 2023 starting 6:00 pm. Admission to the Closing Ceremony & Final Night Banquet will be free for Athletes, one Team Official per Team (or two Team Officials for teams of 8 or more athletes), Technical Officials and IWWF Executive Board Members. **The cost for all others to attend is US\$80.00 per person and the deadline to purchase tickets will be noon Tuesday 10th October 2023. Please reserve any extra tickets you wish to purchase using [this link](#).** All payments are to be made only in cash on site to Nicky Caine.

11.3 IWWF World Congress & IWWF Extraordinary Congress

The IWWF World Congress will be held on Thursday 12th October at the [Clermont Arts & Recreation Center \(directions\)](#) in the [Mainstage Theatre](#). Start time 7:30 pm.

The IWWF Extraordinary Meeting will be held immediately after the IWWF Congress at the same venue from 9:30 pm to 11:30 pm

All Federations wishing to be present must submit their Delegate Appointment PRIOR to 5th October 2023. The forms will be sent in due course.

12. EVENT RULES

All Federations, team managers, team captains and riders should be familiar with the current [IWWF World Waterski Rules](#).

13. IWWF LICENSE

Following an agreement by the IWWF World Congress held in 2019, the IWWF Executive Board approved the establishment of an IWWF License fee from 2021 where athletes wishing to compete in Ranking List / 1 to 6 Star competitions (including IWWF World titled events) in each Sports Division of the IWWF are required to hold an IWWF License. It is requested that Federations ensure that all their athletes hold a valid [IWWF License](#) in order to participate in the 2023 IWWF World Waterski Championships.

14. REGISTRATION OF PARTICIPANTS (WATERSKI ATHLETES) IN EMS

The registration of a skier's participation in EMS has to be done by an EMS Federation Administrator as follows:

1. EMS Federation Administrator has to login to EMS.
2. Go to the Competitions menu and set the Competition Code [23IWWF13](#) and the Country "USA" in the Search Filters.



3. Select the Code **23IWWF13** competition "2023 IWWF World Waterski Championships".
4. Scroll down to the Participations section and click the "New participation" button to register the Athletes.
5. Enter the Name of the Athlete in the Search box and click on the loop sign to the right.
6. Register the Category in Competition, the Event and the Entry Type.
7. Click on the blue "+Add" button and the participant will be registered.

Repeat Steps 5 to 7 for any additional participants

15 TRAINING & OFFICIAL FAMILIARISATION

15.1 Training

Training will be available on Sunset Lake and Lake Sarah between **2nd October and 6th October 2023** and on Lake Grace throughout the competition at a cost of US\$300.00 per hour, and with a minimum booking of 15 minutes. Training will be based on a first come first serve but also consideration will be given for it to be distributed evenly based on total entries.

The deadline for training request is **1st September 2023**. Please submit your training requests by e-mail: h2oskijacks@aol.com. Training should be paid by bank transfer to Jack Travers Waterski School. (Bank details for payments are listed in 15.3 below).

Payment is due 1st September 2023 and a schedule will be posted by 15th September 2023. After the final schedule is released, all available slots will be opened on a first come first serve basis. If your Federation would like to bring its own driver, please contact h2oskijacks@aol.com with that request.

- Lake Sarah will be the competition lake for Trick.
- Sunset Lake will be the competition lake of Slalom and Jump.
- Lake Grace will be available for training throughout the competition for Slalom, Trick and Jump.

15.2 Official Familiarisation

The last two or three days immediately before the Championships will be reserved and used for Official Familiarisation. This will be organised so that each skier who has paid shall be allocated either a set number of passes and/or a certain amount of time at the discretion of the Chief Judge based on the principle that every skier shall receive an equal opportunity for familiarisation.



- Slalom skiers will receive – 4 passes or 6 minutes whichever is less
- Trick skiers will receive – 2 passes or 5 minutes whichever is less
- Jump skier will receive – 3 passes or 6 minutes whichever is less

After closure of the registration, 60 days before the Championships (please ref. to rule 14.12 for the specific deadline), each entered competitor in the IWWF Event Management System (EMS) will be allocated Official Familiarisation time as specified above.

45 days before the scheduled start of the event, the Organiser (in consultation with the Chief Judge, whose decision shall be final) shall announce the Official Familiarisation schedule (including the allowed time). If a Federation does not want to take part in the Official Familiarisation, it must notify the Organisers and the Chief Judge as soon as possible.

The order for familiarisation will be based on the team results from the previous IWWF World Championships with the last placed team athletes going first, and shall be grouped by events, i.e., slalom familiarisation, trick familiarisation and jump familiarisation (by jump height). They will be grouped together. Any athlete whose time has not been paid for at least 30 days before the scheduled start of the event, or who is not ready to ski in accordance with the schedule, will lose their official familiarisation time.

Summary Table:

Scheduled Start of the Championships	October, 10	Description
60 days before	August 11	deadline to enter participants in the EMS as per rule 14.12.
45 days before	August 26	deadline for publishing familiarisation schedule by Organiser
30 days before	September 10	deadline for familiarisation payment.

The Chief Judge shall have the discretion to change the start time of team's familiarisation based on extraordinary circumstances. During the Official Familiarisation period, the Chief Judge may allocate any available site familiarisation times, but only to skiers who have not already used it or do not have time allocated.

15.3 Bank details for Training and Official Familiarisation payments

The Official Familiarisation rate is USD\$30.00 per set and should be paid by bank transfer by 10th September 2023 to Jack Travers Waterski School who will provide bank details. **Please indicate "Name of Country" and "Official Familiarisation 2023 IWWF World Waterski Championships" when making your transfer.*



Remitting parties are responsible for ALL bank charges at both ends. Where bank charges have been deducted, Federations/Skiers will be required to make good any shortfall at registration.

16. ENTRY & ADMINISTRATION:

16.1 Intention to Enter (ITE)

Each Federation shall certify to the Chairman of the World Waterski Council and to the organising committee, not later than 90 days before the scheduled start of the first event of the World Championships, its intent to compete using this [link](#).

Any Federation not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete until they pay a fine of US\$200 to the IWWF.

To be accepted, the "Intention to Enter" must be accompanied by a deposit amounting to US\$50 for each athlete entered on the form. (For instance: 3 athletes: 3xUS\$50 = US\$150). This payment must follow the process described in 16.04 below.

Each US\$50 will be deducted from the entry fee to be paid later for each athlete. If a Federation subsequently enters less athletes than declared on the ITE, the fee of US\$50 paid at that time is forfeited for each missing athlete. The payment must follow the process described in the Competition Bulletins. Any Federation may enter up to two more athletes than originally declared on the "Intention to Enter" form with no penalty, and for which the full entry fee is required. If more than two additional athletes participate, then a levy of US\$50 per additional athlete will be payable in addition to the full entry fee. This does not include those skiers who may additionally qualify through the Weekly Ranking List or Pro Ranking if applicable.

16.2 Official Entry and Entry Fee

The Entry Fee for the 2023 IWWF World Waterski Championships is **US\$390.00 per competitor** regardless of discipline.

The deadline for each Federation to declare, through EMS, the names of the members of its team, the events each will enter, the ratings of each skier, as well as the names of the official reserves, is 60 days before the scheduled start of the first event of the World Championships.



An entry is considered complete when the Skier's name is registered in EMS and the full Entry Fee Payment has been received. The entry fee payment must follow the process described in 16.3 below.

Any skier entered as a Wild Card or Individual is also to be considered as a TEAM reserve.

The 60 days deadline does not include those skiers who may additionally qualify through the Weekly or the Pro Ranking, if applicable, for those skiers the following deadline apply:

- 1) The deadline to enter skiers who qualify under the Weekly Ranking is 30 days before the championships.
- 2) The deadline to enter skiers who qualify under the Pro Ranking is 15 days before the Championships.

Any Federation not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete until the Federation pays a fine to the IWWF Representative at the Championships, of US\$10 per skier per day after the 60 days deadline for each skier not officially entered.

If a skier is not registered on EMS prior to the 48 hours before the start of the first event, the Federation's skier's places in the draw shall be determined by the Chief Judge without reference to their qualifying scores.

2 days before the start of the first event, the entry lists shall be closed at noon (12:00) and thereafter the order of competitors entered and paid will be finalised and posted.

The Scorer in consultation with the Chief Judge should post Preliminary Running Orders 7 days preceding the start of events with the orders clearly marked as "Preliminary and subject to change". No change in this order is allowed after noon of the 2 days preceding the start of events except that a team representative may:

- 1) Withdraw a skier from the competition.
- 2) Replace an injured skier with a qualified official reserve from the same team with the authority of the Chief Judge and before the start of the first event, that is, before the first skier taking part in the first event has started,
- 3) The substitute skier shall start first in the series in which he is qualified unless the draw has not yet been completed.

Team or individual athletes not showing up: In the event a team or individual athletes (for whom their Federation has submitted a competition entry), fail to



show up for a competition, their entry fee shall still be payable in full, unless a valid written excuse is received by 12 noon, 2 days before the start of the competition.

A valid excuse may include a sickness certificate or a certificated injury and should be considered and agreed as valid by the IWWF Representative at the Championships.

All fines have to be paid on-site to the IWWF Representative at the Championships. No skiers will be allowed to start if any due fine is not paid.

16.4 Wild Cards

Each Federation may enter 5 additional single event wild card skiers. The skiers must meet the eligibility rules as defined in IWWF Waterski rule 14:13. A Federation's Wild Cards cannot be transferred to another Federation. For the purpose of this rule Overall is not considered to be a single event.

20.2 USA WATER SKI & WAKE SPORTS (USA-WSWS) SAFE SPORT POLICY

As a USA-WSWS sanctioned competition held in the U.S., all event participants must acknowledge that they have read and will follow the [Safe Sport Handbook](#), adhere to the MAAPP (Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies) protocol found in the USA-WSWS Safe Sport Handbook, and report any suspected or alleged MAAPP violations. No event participant, under any circumstance, should be currently listed on the USA-WSWS [Suspended Members List](#). All participating IWWF-affiliated National Federations must assist



the local organizing committee (LOC) in being compliant with the Safe Sport Sanctioned Event Expectations.

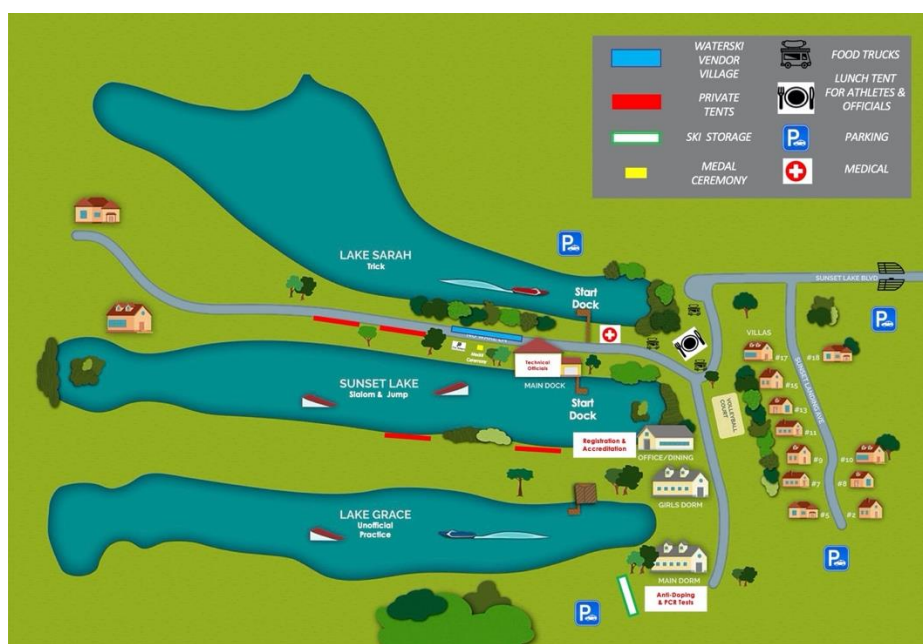
