



2023 IWWF World Disabled Water Ski Championships Bulletin #3

New / Updated Information in Purple

Event:

The 2023 IWWF World Disabled Water Ski Championships will be held at Shortline Lake, Elk Grove CA (USA). (www.dwwsc.org) on September 14-17th. This 3-event site offers ideal skiing conditions and excellent accessibility for everyone. The lake is 2400 ft. (730 m) in length with turn-around islands at both ends. There is ample time for skier set up entering the slalom course and one of the nicest jump ramps west of the Mississippi. We are very excited about the tournament and wish everyone the best of luck.

We are only a few weeks away from tournament time. We hope everyone is getting as excited as we are!

Title Sponsor:

The Barbara Bolding/Jim Grew Fund has graciously pledged to be the title sponsor for the 2023 IWWF World Championships. At the time of her death, Barbara, Jim's fiancée, was a huge fan of disabled water skiing. The BB/JG Fund was established to celebrate her life and love of our sport.

Accommodations:

The Embassy Suites Riverfront will be the host hotel (www.embassysuites.com - once on the website, search for Sacramento Riverfront Promenade). The Embassy is just 20 minutes from the Sacramento airport (www.sacramento.aero/smf) and 35 minutes from Shortline Lake (www.dwwsc.org). The Embassy offers large, spacious rooms at \$229. US/night (up to 3 per room) and includes a made-to-order breakfast every

morning and a complimentary reception from 5-7 every evening.













The hotel is within walking and wheeling distance from great dining, shopping and nightlife. The Sacramento Riverfront Promenade site will provide tourist info. Special note: The LOC is hoping that ALL Teams will stay at host hotel for a family-type atmosphere and ease of transportation.

Officials, etc. will pay the hotel directly for any additional stay, pre or post event.

Meetings and a welcome party will be held at Embassy Suites. All Major Credit Cards Accepted

The closest airport is Sacramento International. (SMF). If you're flying into San Francisco (SFO) you must make your own transportation arrangements.



Transportation:

Transportation to and from the Host Hotel/Shortline Lake will be provided. Please let us know if you'll need daily transportation, how many people, and how many wheelchair users.

<u>2023 Ski Nautique</u> will be the official towboat of the IWWF Barbara Bolding Jim Grew Fund World Disabled Water Ski Championships.

Entry Fees:

Entry Fees will be \$400.00 per skier

Each Team with 4 skiers or fewer is allowed to have 1 Manager/Coach. Teams with more than 4 skiers are allowed 2 Managers/Coach

The Opening Ceremony, Closing Ceremony and Final Night Banquet are offered free of charge to Athletes, Team Officials, Technical Officials, IWWF Disabled Ski Council Members, and IWWF Executive Board Members.

All Team members and officials will receive free admission to the Awards Banquet on Sunday, September 17, 2023, and a lunch voucher during the official











tournament (Sept 14-17). IWWF and all Technical Officials will have a food stipend for non-tournament days. Please contact us immediately if officials and/or dignitaries are bringing a significant other so arrangements can be made.

Opening Ceremony:

Will Be held at Shortline Lake, on Wednesday, September 13, 2023, at 5:00 pm. All Teams must be in their team uniforms. Time is subject to vary with ample notice. Please send us your country's flag so we can display it on-site.

Final Night Banquet/Closing Ceremony:

Will be held at Embassy Suites on Sunday, September 17, 2023, at 7:00 pm. Additional banquet tickets can be purchased in advance at US\$75.00 per person. The dress code is formal team uniform and smart casual for all others.

Transportation:

Transportation from Sacramento airport to the official hotel is provided free of charge to Technical Officials, IWWF Disabled Council Members, IWWF Executive Members, and is available to Athletes/Staff at cost.

Transportation between the official hotel and the event venue is provided free of charge to Technical Officials, IWWF Disabled Council Members, IWWF Executive Board Members, and Athletes.

If you haven't done so, please advise immediately if you need transportation to/from the airport and the official hotel. Please include the number of people in your party and the number of wheelchairs.

Car Rental:

Regrettably, we were unable to obtain a discount for car rental and apologize for any inconvenience.

US Visas:

Most countries will be required to get a US Visa for entry into the United States. Please check with your local consulate to determine if a Visa is necessary. If needed, apply at (www.usvisas.state.gov). Please allow ample time to get your Visa.











Entry & Administration:

Each Federation shall certify to the Chairman of the IWWF World Disabled Ski Council and to the organizing committee, not later than 90 days before the scheduled start of the first event of the World Championships, its intent to compete using the attached Intent to Enter (ITE) Form: download here. Any Federation not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete until they pay a fine of US\$200 to the IWWF. To be accepted, the "Intention to Enter" must be accompanied by a deposit amounting to US\$50 for each athlete entered on the form. (For instance: 3 athletes: 3xUS\$50 = US\$150). Each US\$50 will be deducted from the entry fee to be paid later for each athlete. If a Federation subsequently enters less athletes than declared on the ITE the fee of US\$50 paid at that time is forfeited for each missing athlete.

The payment must follow the process described below.

Any Federation may enter up to two more athletes than originally declared on the "Intention to Enter" form with no penalty, and for which the full entry fee is required. If more than two additional athletes participate, then a levy of US\$50 per additional athlete will be payable in addition to the full entry fee.

Official Entry:

The deadline for each Federation to declare, through <u>EMS</u>, the names of the members of its team, the events each will enter, as well as the names of the official reserves is 60 days before the scheduled start of the first event of the World Championships. An entry is considered complete when the Skier's name is registered in EMS, and the full Entry Fee Payment has been received. **The entry fee payment must follow the process described below.**

Any Federation not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete until the Federation pays a fine to the IWWF Representative at the Championships, of US\$10 per skier per day after the 60 days deadline for each skier not officially entered.

Team or individual athletes not showing up:

In the event a team or individual athletes (for whom their Federation has submitted a competition entry), fails to show up for a competition, their entry fee shall be payable in full, unless a valid written excuse is received by 12 noon of 2 days the day before the start of the competition.

A valid excuse may include a sickness certificate or a certificated injury and should be considered and agreed as valid by the IWWF Representative at the Championships.











The Entry Fee for the event will be **US\$400.00 per participant**, the payment must be made **as per the deadline in the following table**. This Entry Fee includes a levy of US\$30.00 to assist Technical Officials with their travel costs. Payment must be made by bank transfer, to the following account:

Note:

To be accepted the ITE and the Entry must be accompanied with the relative Fee. After the deadlines set out in the table, the fines set out above will be applied.

All fines must be paid on-site to the IWWF Representative at the Championships. No skiers will be allowed to start if any due fine is not paid.

Registration of Participants (Water Ski Athletes) in EMS:

The registration of the skier participation in EMS has to be done by an EMS Federation Administrator as follows:











- 1. EMS Federation Administrator has to login to EMS.
- 2. Go to the Competitions menu and enter the Competition Code 23|WWF08 in the search filters.
- 3. Select the competition listed "2023 IWWF World Disabled Waterski Championships".
- 4. Select the Participations tab and click the "New participation" button to register the Athletes.
- 5. Enter the Name of the Athlete in the Search box and click on the loop sign to the right.
- 6. Register the Category in Competition, the Events "and the Entry Type.
- 7. Click on the blue "Add" button and the participant will be registered.

Repeat Steps 5 to 7 for any additional participants

Official Familiarization:

The two days immediately before the Championships will be reserved for familiarization. Each skier participating in familiarization shall be allotted:

- 2 passes in slalom
- 2 passes in tricks
- 2 passes in jump

at the discretion of the Chief Judge based on the principle that every skier shall receive an equal opportunity for familiarization.

Familiarization will be run under tournament conditions. No persons other than the ones allowed under tournament rules are permitted in the boat.

The schedule for familiarization shall be run in the reverse order of team placement of the preceding World Championships, and shall be grouped by event, i.e., slalom familiarization, audio slalom familiarization, trick familiarization and jump familiarization (by jump height) will be grouped. Federation teams that did not enter the preceding World Championships will have familiarization before the other teams in an order decided by the Chief Judge. Individual qualifiers will be assigned individual familiarization time at times determined by the Chief Judge. The Chief Judge shall have the discretion to change the start time of an individual's or team's familiarization based on extraordinary circumstances.

The Site Familiarization schedule is posted on the <u>official website</u>. It's a little different than years past so make sure you see the new format. It will be posted at host hotel.

Unofficial Practice:

Unofficial practice sets can be purchased for Monday, September 11th from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm PST for \$30 USD per time slot. Time slots will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. We want all athletes to have a chance to practice on the tournament lake. So, skiers may purchase a set "in advance" for round one ONLY. Skiers can purchase a time slot for round 2 on site only, and only at the conclusion of round 1. Please be aware that the opportunity to ski on the tournament lake on Monday, September 11 is being provided as a courtesy. We will need to be courteous and efficient to accommodate as many skiers as possible. As of today, there are 46 individual entrants from 11 countries.

A set may NOT exceed 10 min. General guidelines for each set are as follows:

- Slalom, 6 passes or 2 falls
- Trick, 6 passes or 2 falls
- Jump, 2 jumps

A time block will be reserved for Audio Slalom from 8:00 am - 10:00 am. However, after all of the VI skiers have completed at least one set, the buoys will be reconfigured, and the round 1 running order will start.

Time slots are approximate. Actual time may change based on conditions. The running order will be maintained at the starting dock.

The ramp height will be set at 1.25m (4').

Skiers must be ready when their turn comes up. If a skier is not ready, the next skier on the list will be allowed to start. If a skier misses her turn, then she may be added back into the round 1 starting list at the end of the list. Refunds will NOT be provided for no shows.

Round 1 practice sets will be open for purchase starting on Wednesday, 8/30. How to signup:

To be able to complete/populate their profiles, the Athletes must be EMS USERS, i.e. they must be invited by their respective Federations to become EMS users and have accepted this invitation.
